Cookbags

To capitalise on this interest of the bags shown during the Moshoeshoe walk, Ken returned to Lesotho in May to launch an initiative to manufacture and activate 300 Eco Cook Bags. This is expected to occupy the sewing team for the next 3 months. Funding for this work is largely due to the kind and generous support of Paul and Clare Keen.

Activation will be an important activity over winter. We plan to link this with work to reinforce good practice in using Eco Cook Bags amongst existing users to ensure maximum impact.

Cookbags & Recipe's

The Moshoeshoe walk coincided with the launch of a new cookbook embracing Basotho recipes for the Cookbag. This offered a major promotion opportunity for the Eco Cook Bag. This was supported by a grant from the British High Commission, drawing on funds from the FCDO.







In May, in conjunction with our partners Sheffield Hallam University and its Helena Kennedy Research Centre we were delighted to host His Majesty King Letsie III and his senior delegation from Lesotho. The party of 21 included senior ministers, high commissioners and academics and the meeting allowed time for a celebration of what has been achieved together thus far and where future efforts may be concentrated. His Majesty was presented with an Eco Cook Bag - made in Lesotho, by Basotho, from Lesotho waste - but presented in Yorkshire!





Research The sharing of the University's review of the impact of Cook Bags on the lives of people in rural Lesotho attracted great interest. This review was very positive about the benefits to: health (less smoke inhalation), environment (less wood and water used cooking) and lifestyle (more time free to grow vegetables, support the family and to engage with the community).



Malealea Development Trust

While in Lesotho, Ken with the Malealea Development Trust spent time reviewing the next steps in developing to community projects in Tsinyane and in Masemouse. It is heartening to report that the commitment and leadership available in both communities and has begun to develop a detailed plan for next steps within both communities. While we have a major £5000 donation kindly donated by Kenneth Allen for the works in Tsinyane & Masemouse, we will need to raise more money to realise the community's full ambitions. Stocking the fish farm is an exciting part of the work
